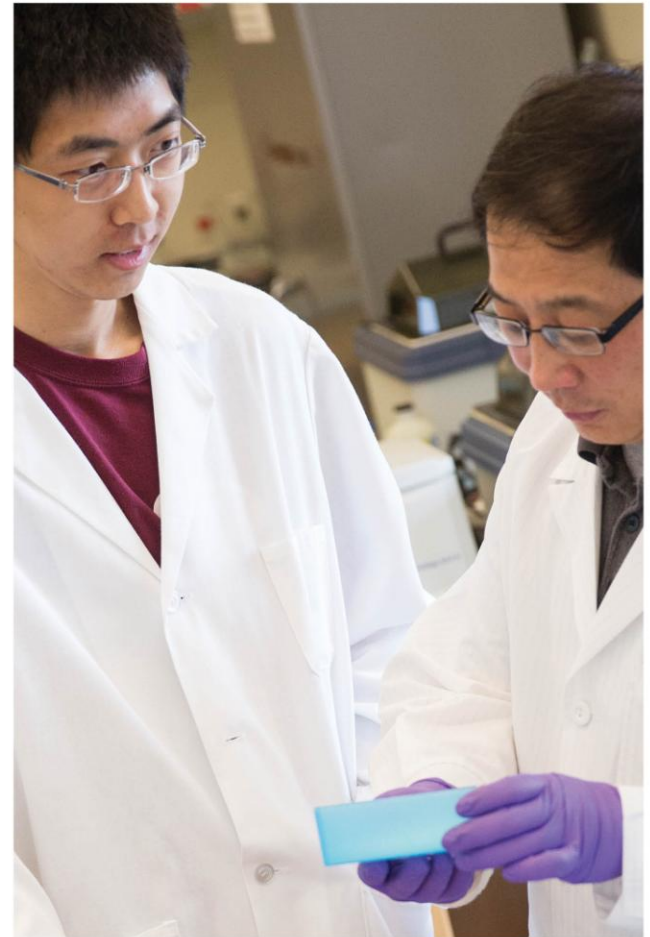

Scholarships

- The University of Nebraska – Lincoln awards scholarships to 40% of all incoming international students each year.
- UNL offers the lowest tuition in the Big 10 Conference while providing superior academic experiences and opportunities for success.
- Global Laureate: \$13,500/year
- Global Ambassador: \$9,000/year
- Global Delegate: \$3,000/year
- The University of Nebraska – Lincoln evaluates each individual applicant for a series of merit based scholarships. Scholarship consideration is based upon test scores, the rigor and quality of secondary academic courses, cumulative and core grade point average, school profile, and their chosen program of study.
- Students will be notified of any scholarships via email. Scholarships are not valid until students are fully admitted. Prior to full admission students are responsible for all tuition and fees for the IEP and AFCIEP.

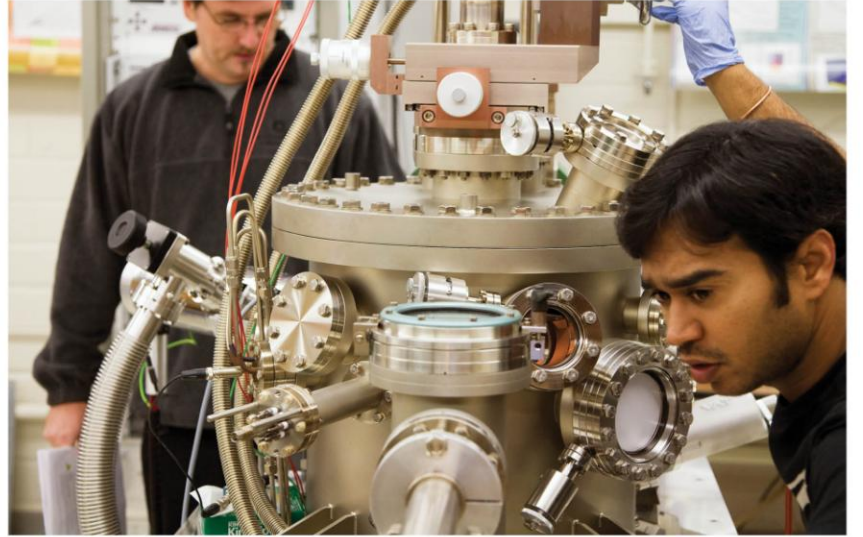

Campus Recreation Center *crec.unl.edu*

Intensive English Program global.unl.edu/iep

The IEP is for students who are conditionally admitted.

- Intensive English language study 20 hours per week
- Sessions begin in each academic term
- All levels of study

Credit English for Academic Purposes Bridge Program global.unl.edu/academics/ceap

The CEAP is for conditionally admitted students who have an advance level of English proficiency, below the minimum requirement for full admission.

- Three advanced level English courses with one additional class in your area of study for a total of 12 hours of university credit
- TOFL = 61 total with writing subscore of 17
- IELTS = 5.0 total with writing subscore of 4.5

Full Admission

Students who have met the English proficiency and academic requirements to begin their degree program and UNL.

- Students must submit an additional Honors application after having been admitted to UNL
- Fully admitted students can pursue a full degree course load
- TOEFL = 70 total with writing subscore of 20
- IELTS = 6.0 total with writing subscore of 5.5

English Proficiency Requirements

To be considered for full admission students who are non-native English language speakers must meet the following English proficiency requirements:

- English Proficiency for full Admission
- Internet Based TOEFL (IBT) – 70 composite with 20 writing sub score
- Paper Based TOEFL (PBT)* – 523 composite
- IELTS* – 6.0 composite with 5.5 writing sub score
- ACT English Sub Score* – 20
- SAT Critical Reading Score* – 470

**Students presenting these demonstrations of English proficiency will be required to take the UNL English Placement Exam upon arrival at UNL for course placement – they will remain fully admitted regardless of score.*

Admission to UNL

To qualify for admission students must meet the following core course and performance requirements. Although not all education systems use the exact number of courses in a particular subject, all students must meet the following general requirements for admission.

Core Courses

- English
- Math
- Social Science
- Natural Science
- Native Language

Performance Requirements

- 2.0 Cumulative GPA
- 2.0 Previous Semester GPA*

**International Transfer Only*

**All grades will be converted to a U.S. 4.0 grade point average scale

Apply

- Students must apply for the term in which they plan to enroll
- Application Requirements
 - Application (online)
 - \$45 Fee
 - H.S. Transcripts (Both Native Language and English Translation)
 - H.S. Certificate/Diploma (Both Native Language and English Translation)
 - College Transcript if transferring from another university (Both Native Languages and English Translation)
 - English Proficiency (Only if student indicates a native language other than English)
 - Bank statement

English translations must be certified from institution that originally issued grades, US Embassy (EducationUSA), Ministry of Education or official notary.

- All documents must be original or certified copies and must be sent directly to the Office of Admissions

Admissions Letter and I-20

To receive the form I-20 students must submit a bank statement. The bank statement is not required at the initial point of admission but will be required to issue an I-20 and admission letter. Bank statements can be emailed to admissions@unl.edu

I-20 Requirements

- Bank statement
 - Document issued from the bank of the financial sponsor indicating that sponsor has the necessary funds for the student. This can also include scholarship letters.
 - Total must equal or exceed \$40,599 for fall 2015 and spring 2016

Honors Program

English Proficiency Deadline

- Fall: July 15
- Spring: December 1

Scholarships

- Students studying at UNL through a partnership scholarship must be fully admitted to their degree program to receive their award.
- Scholarships may not be used for IEP or CEAP fees.
